Dear Parents and/or Carers,

This week has been wonderfully busy, filled with a variety of activities across the school. Our Year 2 children have completed their violin lessons and had the opportunity to showcase their progress in a delightful performance for family members. It was heartwarming to see so many visitors in school, sharing in the joy of watching our pupils shine brightly.

Meanwhile, Key Stage I and Reception classes have begun rehearsals for their Christmas performance, while Key Stage 2 students are busy learning festive songs in Praise Worship in preparation for our Christmas worship. The excitement for the season is building, and we have a host of Christmas activities planned, including a whole-school Christmas craft afternoon, our festive Christmas lunch, and the eagerly anticipated Christmas pantomime. Yesterday, I had the pleasure of meeting with several local headteachers, and they were impressed by how we've managed to incorporate so many festive events into our already packed schedules.

On a different note, I also met with the Finance team this week, who brought to light the significant portion of our curriculum budget currently being used to cover outstanding debts from school lunches. To address this, and in line with other schools within our trust, we have made the decision to implement a £20 debt limit for school lunches. If this limit is exceeded, your child will unfortunately be unable to place further lunch orders until the balance is cleared.

We deeply regret having to take such measures, but it is vital to ensure that curriculum resources—so essential for our children's learning—are not compromised. Thank you for your support with this.

Reading outside of school is essential for primary-aged children as it nurtures a love for learning, strengthens literacy skills, and deepens the bond between parent and child. At our school, we believe "together we shine brightly because together we make a difference".

By reading at least three times a week with a parent, families and children work hand in hand to create a brighter future, empowering every child to succeed and make a meaningful impact. Please try to build in time during your day to listen to your child read and record in their reading record.





As you already know, we are a Nut-Free school... This means that the following items should not be brought into school:

- Packs of nuts
- Peanut butter or Nutella sandwiches
- Fruit and cereal bars that contain nuts
- Chocolate bars or sweets that contain nuts
- Sesame seed rolls (children allergic to nuts may also have a severe reaction to sesame)
- Cakes made with nuts
- Any home cooked meals for packed lunches that are made from nuts
- Pesto sauce



If your child is absent due to illness, please contact the school office on 01453 542304 before 9.30am. Please do this for everyday of the absence, unless the office have confirmed they do not need daily updates. Please do not use Class Dojo to report absence. If you do not contact us to inform of an absence, and we cannot get hold of you, the school will consider contacting the police to carry out a welfare check on the child.

If your child has an appointment, please let the office know as soon as possible, and provide evidence of the appointment. A reminder that appointments where possible should be booked outside of school time, but we realise that this is not always possible. If your child does have an appointment in the morning, please can you let the office know your child's meal preference for the day.

What does it mean to be a parent governor?

Being a parent governor means that you will:

- Develop a greater role in pupils' education.
- Become a key player in monitoring the progress of the school.
- Be part of the local leadership team.
- Be asked to dedicate time to the development of the school to ensure the best possible outcomes for all pupils.
- Learn new skills or develop as a strategic leader with an opportunity to make a real difference to the school and its pupils.
- Secure an active role in all aspects of school life – from policy development to recruitment!

What would the parent governor do?

As the elected parent governor, you would:

- Make decisions in collaboration with the rest of the local governing board.
- Bring a parental viewpoint and perspective to discussion and debate remembering the role is not to represent individual parents' views (including your own).
- Support the local governing board in its strategic monitoring of the school's improvement priorities.
- Ask questions and provide challenge to support the local governing board's monitoring activities.

Who is the school looking for?

We are looking for a dedicated and motivated parent who is keen to learn more about the school and contribute to school life. You will learn more about the governance of the school and DGAT and work with the rest of the local governors and school community. This is a great opportunity to develop skills in leadership, strategic planning and monitoring and teamwork. We welcome a diverse range of views and roles on the local governing board.

We are looking for someone who is able to ask questions and is curious. You don't need to have been a governor before, the governing board will support you with an induction and relevant training.

Becoming the parent governor
